Official Medical Fee Schedule - Physician Fees - Draft Conversion Factors for Pre-Rulemaking Public Comment

The Division of Workers' Compensation is publishing draft physician fee regulations on the DWC internet Forum for public discussion prior to formal rulemaking. For services other than anesthesia, the current draft regulations suggest conversion factors that will transition from three conversion factors to one conversion factor over a period of four years, maintaining overall budget neutrality each year. In the fourth year there would be a single budget neutral conversion factor for all but anesthesia. The anesthesia service category, which has a different relative value methodology, maintains one budget neutral conversion factor for that section (\$33.9815143289).

There are two tables below. The first shows the proposed conversion factors. The second table shows the percent by which the various conversion factors increase or decrease each year of the transition.
