MR. CORTES: All right. Good morning, everyone. My name is John Cortes. I'm an Industrial Relations Counsel for the Division of Workers' Compensation.

Before I open today's hearing to public comment, I want to inform everyone that this hearing is being recorded.

Now, this hearing is being recorded to assist our hearing reporter. We will not be sharing the recording, but as is always the case, we will post the transcript of this hearing prepared by our hearing reporter on our rulemaking web page.

I want to quickly go over the instructions on how to give a verbal comment during today's hearing. There are two ways to do so. First, if you've logged onto this Zoom public hearing from a PC, Mac, Linux, iOS, or Android, please send a chat to Request to Speak and provide your full name (first and last name) and who you're affiliated with, or company name, if any. Individuals will be called in the order of receipt of request. To send a chat, find the chat option. And it's likely towards the bottom of your screen, but it depends on your device and your settings. Choose Request to Speak. Type the information requested and click send or hit enter.

Request to Speak will respond by acknowledging your request.

Please do not send more than one request. There may be

multiple requests being processed at the same time, so a reply

may not be instantaneous. If you can, please be patient with us.

Do not send a chat to any other co-host besides

Request to Speak because it will not be acknowledged.

Request to Speak is the only person monitoring this chat during the hearing. Also, do not send your written comments through the chat. Any written comments sent via the chat thread will be ignored.

Finally, please update your name that will be shown on the screen so that it properly reflects your name. This will allow my assistants to locate you in the queue and then timely unmute you when it's your turn to make a verbal comment. To rename yourself, click onto the three dots on your picture screen and click rename.

I want to thank you for participating in today's public hearing. Again, my name is John Cortes. I'm an Industrial Relations Counsel for the Division of Workers' Compensation.

This is our noticed public hearing for the evidence-based update to the Medical Treatment Utilization

Schedule, also known as the MTUS. The Division is proposing to make evidence-based updates to the MTUS by adopting the 
American College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine, or the acronym is ACOEM, Low Back Disorders Guideline.

Now, I'd like to take a moment to introduce the other DWC staff members who have also joined us today. With us is George Parisotto, DWC's Administrative Director, and also joining us is Dr. Raymond Meister, DWC's Executive Medical Director. Our hearing reporter today is Monica Manar.

Now, the purpose of this hearing is to receive comments on the proposed amendments to the regulations, and we welcome any comments you have about them. Please note we will not ask questions, respond to or discuss anyone's comments, although we may ask for clarification or ask you to elaborate further on any points that you're presenting. This is your turn to speak. All of your comments, both given verbally here today and those submitted in writing, will be considered in determining what revisions, if any, we make to the proposed regulations.

Please restrict the subject of your comments to the proposed regulations. Your time allotted to make a verbal comment is limited to approximately five minutes. Now, this is not a hard stop, but I will give you a warning to wrap up your

comments if you go beyond the five-minute mark. If you do not wrap up your comments within a reasonable time after this warning, your time will be cut off.

I will call the names of those who have indicated they wish to comment today, and I apologize in advance if I mispronounce anyone's name.

All testimony today will be taken down by the hearing reporter, again, Monica Manar. She has the green light to interrupt a commenter to request a spelling of a word, seek clarification of any phrase, or ask a speaker to please slow down, if need be.

When everyone on this list has had a chance to make their public comment, I will check to see if anyone else still wants to make a verbal comment. The hearing will continue for as long as there are people on this Zoom hearing who wishes to comment on the proposed regulations, but it will close no later than 5 o'clock this afternoon. If the hearing continues into the lunch hour, we will take at least an hour break.

Finally, in lieu of making a verbal comment during the hearing, or if you wish to supplement your verbal comment made, you may submit a written comment. Any notice of changes and the final notice to the evidence-based update to the MTUS will be sent to everyone who requests that information.
